
PORTFOLIO SNAPSHOT

GAFSP Portfolio:

\$1.02 Billion in grants to 39 Projects, in 30 countries

Geographic Distribution: 60% of funds support interventions in Africa (US\$ millions)

Project Status: 82% of projects under implementation (Number of Projects)




\$391 million was disbursed to recipient governments as of June 30, 2016, an increase of 21% from December 2015.

To date, over a third of beneficiaries are female - In Gambia, Liberia, Nepal, and Nicaragua, the majority of beneficiaries are women and girls.

Over **33**% of the total GAFSP portfolio generates **climate adaptation** and/or **mitigation benefits**, compared to a 25% commitment under IDA-17.

Bangladesh is allocating 100% of funds to these efforts.



60% of GAFSP public sector projects address all 3 elements of gender mainstreaming (analysis, genderinformed action, and gender-disaggregated M&E).

Nepal project focuses primarily on women.



15% of GAFSP public sector funding is targeted to nutrition activities. \$154M across 20 countries is invested in nutrition-sensitive agriculture and other nutrition specific activities.


Strong nutrition focus in **Uganda** multisectoral project housed in health ministry.




GAFSP allocates **38%** of funds to **8 fragile or conflicted-affected states.**

GAFSP funds projects in Burundi, Haiti, Liberia, Mali, Sierra Leone, Timor Leste, Togo and Yemen.

Cambodia Emergency Food Assistance Project (\$24.5m)

Main findings from government's completion report:

- The number of food insecure households (HHs) decreased from 69% to 37%
- Target HHs reduced their rate of Chronic Malnutrition by 10.8% (compared to a 3.5% reduction for non-target HHs; the end of project target was 6%)
- Average monthly income among target HHs increased by 85% to \$203 from \$110 (non-target HH monthly income increased by 38%).
- Average rice yield for target HHs increased by 33% for wet season rice and 69% for dry season rice (significantly exceeded target of 20%).
- By completion, the EFAP supported 307,473 foodinsecure households or 1,352,880 poor and vulnerable people (200% of target).

While GAFSP funding has completed, the IDA cofinancing project will close only on June 30, 2017. Main findings from government's interim completion report:

- Productivity in target irrigated area increased to \$2,575/ha from \$492/ha (423% increase)
- Share of commercialized products from target areas increased to 76% from 35% (100% increase)
- Access to formal financial services increased to 82% of men (80% of women) from 22% of men (18% of women)
- 82% of target households consuming acceptable food consumption basket due to the project's support to nutrition
- Share of farmers who have adopted improved farming methods increased to 95% of male farmers (94% female) from 30% male (25% female)

While GAFSP funding has completed, the IDA cofinancing project will close only on April 30, 2017.

- As of end 2015, 363,239 farmers, including 75,170 women, have adopted technologies being promoted by AGP.
- The construction of 9,030 hectares of new irrigation and drainage services and the improvement and rehabilitation of 3,733 hectares of existing services have met the irrigation water needs of more than 42,700 people.
- To improve irrigation capacity, 39 existing modern irrigation schemes (3733 ha capacity) and 126 traditional (4299 ha capacity) schemes were upgraded.
- The program has approved the construction of a total of 194 new Small-scale Irrigation (SSI) subprojects that have irrigating capacity of 20,720 hectares of land and benefitting a total of 46,328 Farmer HHs.
